



# Tameside & Glossop Neighbourhood Summit

In Tameside and Glossop, we want to **celebrate progress** in developing our neighbourhoods. We also want to continue to improve the **quality of and life opportunities for our residents**. As the number of people in Tameside & Glossop who require health and care support is increasing, we will need to collectively continue to transform how we work together to drive these improvements within ever tighter financial constraints. We know that often people are managing a number of illnesses and long term conditions and that many of these stem from reduced life opportunities.

We therefore want to continue to develop services to **focus on supporting residents**, whether at a young age, through a strong focus on ensuring school readiness, providing a good quality education, increasing access to skills, training and employment choices or whether an adult or in later life through ensuring good quality housing, pleasant environments to live, a wide range of work opportunities and the ability to age well in supportive communities.

People in Tameside and Glossop deserve **services of the highest quality** that are provided as locally as possible. Local leaders of services like the local authority, police, fire, health and education sectors believe that people should sit at the heart of proactive systems, centred on them and their family. In order to put people at the heart of their own needs – rather than process and systems – we need to work together more closely. This requires courage, a bold new vision, joined up planning, a willingness to change and, most importantly, the **engagement and participation of local people**.

Our innovative Strategic Commission brings Tameside Council and NHS Tameside & Glossop Clinical Commissioning Group together to understand opportunities for closer working between public services for the benefit of our residents. Working closely with Tameside & Glossop Integrated Care NHS Foundation Trust under the umbrella of Care Together, our neighbourhood developments continue at pace. Our model of working was one of the **first to be established** and we continue to share our local model far and wide across the country.

To mark the ground-breaking work and significant shift in the way that services are being delivered in Tameside and Glossop we are hosting a Neighbourhood Summit on Wednesday 30 January 2019 to **showcase and celebrate the impact of our work**.

Nearly three years ago, Greater Manchester took control of the £6 billion spent on health and social care in all ten localities, including Tameside and Glossop. With a further £450 million up front provided by central government to **transform services**, Greater Manchester was given the power locally to deliver significant benefits – **helping people live happier, healthier lives**.

This event will also include a **key note speech by Jon Rouse**, Chief Officer of the Greater Manchester Health and Social Care Partnership outlining progress to date and forthcoming plans along with **insight from senior leaders** from Tameside and Glossop.

Our event programme will be delivered across two parts:-

- Firstly, we will share highlights and achievements of our work locally and what the joined up partnership working has delivered. Delegates will then have the opportunity to visit each neighbourhood area stand to hear key messages from across a range of partners and see what a difference their work is having for their communities and contribute to the future development of key areas.
- Secondly, there will be an opportunity to learn more about the difference Greater Manchester devolution is making to the vision for our future health and care services and a Q&A session.

Throughout the day there will be highly interactive market stalls where delegates can find out more about local public services and the many initiatives that are being delivered to improve our resident's lives, health & wellbeing.
